MILITARY TRIBUNAL

Seven cases were brought up by the Military representative for review. The first one taken was that of Sydney DORE, house furnisher, 3 Warwick Street. Applicant said since he was last before the Tribunal his mother had died and left the business to him. His three sisters worked in the business, and he had also his brother's widow and her three children to provide for. He did most of the work himself, and was out nearly all day. If he had to join up it would mean entire ruin.

By the Mayor.: His sisters could not carry on the business. He had a brother in business in opposition to him.

By Mr. HAYDEN. If the outside business was discontinued there would not be sufficient left to keep the shop going. Conditional exemption was withdrawn, and the 15th August substituted, with leave to appeal.
