NAVAL VETERAN'S DEATH

The death occurred at 49 Albert-street on Thursday week of Mr. **Arthur Henry DYER**, aged 78. He was born at St. Helens and was the third son of the late Capt. William DYER, of Fishbourne, a local pilot. When he was 14 he ran away to sea and enlisted in the Royal Navy. He was a leading gunner in H.M.S. Southampton when she was crippled in the Battle of Jutland, and in the action was severely wounded in the eye. He recovered in Haslar Hospital, but was invalided from the Service. Afterwards he served in several large yachts and raced as a hand in H.M. Britannia when King George V was on board. He was a keen sportsman, and as a young man played cricket for Wootton and football for Binstead. He leaves a widow, four sons, and four daughters.

The Rev. T. J. FOINETTE officiated at the funeral at Ryde Cemetery on Monday. The mourners were Messrs. W.A., V.F., R.C., and H. DYER (sons), Messrs. E. HAZARD, and C. COSSINS (sons-in-law), Messrs. C. and R. BRETT (grandsons), and Mr. W. BOURNE (brother-in-law), representing Mrs. BOURNE, sister). The Darby and Joan Club and Brethren's Mission Hall were represented and sent floral tributes.
