BINSTEAD SAD DEATH

We regret to record the death of Mrs. **Emma DYER**, wife of Mr. Robert DYER, of Binstead. The deceased was of robust constitution, and had scarcely had a days illness in her life, and it was her practice to get up at 4 o'clock every morning. It appears she was walking home from Ryde in middle of the day and on her way had a seizure, being found in a collapse condition in a ditch. She was taken to the house of her daughter Mrs. TUTTON, Elm View, Abingdon-road, Ryde, where in spite of careful nursing she succumbed on the 2nd inst.

The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery on Wednesday, the 5th, the mourners being deceased's husband, Mrs. TUTTON (daughter) and her husband, Mrs. COLLINS, (grand-daughter), Mr. F. K. DYER (Niton), brother-in-law, and Mrs. CHAMBERS, who nursed deceased during her illness. Wreaths were sent by the daughter and son-in-law, Mrs. COLLINS and husband, Mrs. CHAMBERS, and one from the Mother's Meeting at Binstead to which the late Mrs. DYER belonged. The Rev. W. E. BELLEW Primitive Methodist minister, carried out the Burial Service, and Mr. F. WOODFORD was the undertaker.
