Death of Mrs. DYER.- The death took place at 97 Arthur-street on Wednesday week of Mrs. Lilian Vida DYER, wife of Mr. V. F. DYER, at the age of 46. For practically the whole of her life Mrs. DYER had been actively identified with St. James's Church, first as a Sunday-school scholar, then as a teacher, and subsequently as a member of the choir, Women's Guild, and Young Harvester's Union. Deep sympathy is felt with her husband, son and daughter in their bereavement.

The funeral took place on Saturday, the first part of the service being at St. James's Church. The choir, with Miss COLE at the organ, led the singing of the hymns, "Through the night of doubt and sorrow" and "Love divine." besides the family mourners many members of the church were present. The interment was in the Cemetery. The flowers included tributes from the Rev. E. E. M. GREEN and members of the church, the St. James's Youth Fellowship, and the Women's Guild.
