Death of Mr. J. H. EAMES.---A well known and much esteemed lifelong resident of the borough passed away on Friday in the person of Mr. James Henry EAMES, aged 78, of Lynton, Well-street, who until his retirement about eight years ago had worked as a jobbing gardener.
