**DEATH OF MAJOR J. ELLERY.-** General regret is felt at the death of an old and much respected resident in the person of Major J. ELLEY, who passed away at his residence, Barfield House, on Tuesday afternoon, in his 69th year. He had been in failing health for some time and was taken ill on Good Friday, since when he had been confined to bed. Of a quiet and unassuming nature, the late Major ELLERY, while not taking a prominent part in public life, was a keen Volunteer and had about 30 years' service in Princess Beatrice's I.W. Rifles. A keen patriot, he afterwards devoted his energies to the organisation of the National Reserve, and was regarded as one of the veterans of the Volunteer movement. His services as churchwarden at the Parish Church were also highly valued for many years, where he was fellow-warden with Ald. J. B. PURNELL and Mr. W. WATTS. He was a prominent Freemason and a member of the East Medina Lodge, 175, of which he has been treasurer for 25 years. He was the last surviving child of the late Mr. Joseph ELLERY, and carried on the well-known business of monumental sculptors founded by his father, a former Mayor of the Borough, in 1847. Widespread sympathy is felt for the widow, his two sons, and daughter, who mourn his loss.

The funeral takes place at the parish Church at 2.30 on Saturday.
