Death of Mr. G. EMERY.- We regret to record the death of Mr. George EMERY on Friday week at his residence, Finsbury, Player-street, at the age of 70. When 14 years of age he commenced a long and honourable career with Messrs. CHAPLIN and after a while in their Gosport office came to Ryde as a clerk. Subsequently he was transferred to Portsmouth and afterwards held managerial appointments for the firm in Salisbury and Guildford before returning to take charge at Ryde, retiring in 1932 after 45 years' service.
