We regret to announce the death, at the Home Hospital, on Thursday, of Mrs. Agnes Maud ENGLAND, of "Glenross," High Park Road, Elmfield, after a long illness. She was 69 years of age.

A native of Ryde, Mrs. ENGLAND and her family lived for some years in East Cowes, until their home in Minerva Road was severely damaged in an air raid and they moved to Ryde. About five years ago she was injured in a bus accident in Elmfield, since when her health had steadily deteriorated, and it is felt the loss of her husband 18 months ago aggravated her condition. Mrs. ENGLAND leaves three sons and a daughter.

The funeral service, conducted by the Rev. A. J. PEARMAN (vicar), took place at St. John's Church on Monday, followed by interment in her husband's grave at Ryde Cemetery.
