DEATH OF MR. W. E. FAULKNER.---We regret to announce the death on Saturday last, of Mr. W. E. FAULKNER, of the Battery Hotel, Springvale, at the age of 52.

The interment took place at the Cemetery on Wednesday, the Rev. H. B. BREW officiating. Deceased was buried in the same grave as his mother and step-father, who only predeceased him by a few days. For many years deceased was a sergeant in the local Volunteers and he was a P.P.G.M. of the Oddfellows.

Battery Hotel, Springvale

This hotel took its name from the adjacent military encampment. It opened in 1830 and was originally known as the Bath Tavern, changing to the Battery in 1850. In 1878 the landlord, William Brown, named it Brown's Hotel, but it reverted back to its former name after he retired. It exists today, drawing a good trade from visitors to nearby Puckpool Park, sited in the old battery overlooking the Solent.
