Death of Mrs. FETHERSTONHAUGH.-The sympathy of the inhabitants of Ryde and the Island generally is extended to General R. S. FETHERSTONHAUGH, C.B., in the irreparable loss he has sustained by the death of his wife, which occurred rather suddenly at his residence, Gwydyr House, on Wednesday evening. Mrs. FETHERSTONHAUGH complained of not feeling well on Tuesday, her doctor attended her on Wednesday afternoon and she died before dinner that evening.

The deceased lady was the youngest daughter of the late Capt. George Dickson, a member of a well-known Island family, whose two brothers, Sir COLLINGWOOD DICKSON and Admiral John DICKSON, lived in Ryde for a number of years, the former at Gwydyr House. Mrs. FORDYCE-BIRCH, the only daughter, was in London at the time and did not reach Ryde until Thursday. It will be remembered that the General had two sons, Lieuts. Richard and George FETHERSTONHAUGH, made the great sacrifice in the early days of the war. The funeral takes place on Monday with a service at the Parish-church at 1.30.
