DEATH OF A RESPECTED FORESTER

We have to record the death of Mr. **Leonard FORD**, who for some years has carried on the business of a baker, &c., at Haylands, and who was generally esteemed by a very large circle of friends. The funeral took place at the Ryde Cemetery, on Sunday afternoon, when some 120 brethren of Court Astreae, A.O.F. (of which order for 25 years the deceased had been a member) followed the funeral cortege, as a last mark of respect, Brs. WHITE, BENNETT, and FAIRALL, acting as pallbearers. A number of Odd Fellows also showed their respect by attending. The Rev. A.G. LONDRUM, curate of St. Michael's, Swanmore, conducted the service at the grave. The P.C.R., Br. A. WARD, read the customary Forester's service after which the brethren present dropped sprigs of myrtle upon the coffin.
