The grave was covered with 40 wreaths, including one from the Baptist Church.

NB: A discrepancy has been noted in the spelling of the surname Fountain/Fountaine. Prior to 1900 it was spelt Fountain in all records found, including the birth registration of Walter. From the birth of Eva 1900 onwards it changed to Fountaine.
