

Death of Mr. C. FRIPP.- By the death on Sunday at his residence, Lyndfield, St. James's-street, of Mr. Charles FRIPP, the borough losses a much respected resident of many years' standing. Mr. FRIPP, who was 75 years of age, came of a very well known Lyndhurst family and on his arrival in the town 47 years ago he soon began to make an ever widening group of friends who will greatly miss his familiar figure.
