DEATH OF MR. M. GADD.---We regret to announce the death of Mr. Montgomery GADD, which occurred at Parkside, Park-road, on Friday week, after a short illness. Ninety-one years of age, the late Mr. GADD was a remarkable old gentleman. In his prime he was well known in the financial world, and many bold and successful undertakings stand to his credit. He was particularly interested in a scheme of his own for the standardisation of silver. He came to Ryde from Wimbledon six years ago, and made himself well known and highly respected in the town. His wife's death, some six months ago, was a great grief to him, but he remained active and interested in affairs up to the few days' illness from which he gradually weakened and died. He leaves a son, Captain Claude GADD, of the Canadian Reserve, and one daughter, who is in California.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. J. E. EDDIS, B.D., taking the service. The only mourners were Captain C. GADD and Mr. PACK, an old friend.
