DEATH OF MRS. GALE

The death took place at Wilmington House, St. John's-hill, on Saturday of Mrs. Florence Emily Jessie GALE, wife of Mr. Albert J. GALE. Deceased, who passed away in her sleep after a short illness, was 62 years of age. Mrs. GALE was very well known in the neighbourhood, where she was held in high regard. She was a very capable business woman and one who will be greatly missed for her many acts of kindness. She had been a successful exhibitor of chrysanthemums at the Newport and Ryde shows. Mrs. GALE was a popular member of St. John's Women's Institute. Much sympathy is felt for the husband and family.

The funeral was on Wednesday, the service being held at the High-street Methodist Church, the Rev. O. FINLAY officiating. The mourners were Messrs. A. J. GALE (husband), A. A. and R. L. GALE (sons), R. A. and W.L. Morris (brothers), W. J. S. and A. E. S. JACKSON (sons-in-law), F. E. JOLLIFE (brother-in-law), H. COOPER (cousin), J. ATTRILL, and C. PRUCE (friends). Among a large gathering at the church were Messrs. H. V. TAYLOR, T.C., T. H. S. JACKSON, C. MARTIN, R. NUNN, F. CALLAWAY, F. C. CANN, W. CASEY, E. E. TRUCKLES, J. DIMMER (Cowes), and Miss A. KING (Seaview), Mrs. MORRIS and Mrs. MARTIN (Cowes), Mrs. ATTRILL and Mrs. PAYNE (Newport), Miss STIRLING, Mrs. SWEETMAN, and Mrs. TILL. The St. John's Women's Institute were represented by Mesdames WOLFE, HUNNEYBOURNE, QUELCH, WEATHERALL, and GROVES. The interment was at the Cemetery and over 60 beautiful wreaths included tributes from the High-street Methodist Church and the St. John's Women's Institute.

Mr. F. WOODFORD was the undertaker.
