THE FUNERAL- of Mrs. E. H. GALLIENNE, of Elmfield, took place at St. John's Church on Sunday, the choral service being conducted by the Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. W. N. MARTIN). The 23rd Psalm was chanted, and the hymns sung were "Our blest Redeemer" and "hark, hark, my soul." The family mourners were: Mrs. RAYNER and Mrs. BURGESS (daughters), Masters Ray and Tony BURGESS (grandsons), Mr. D. RAYNER (son-in-law), Mrs. BUTCHERS and Mrs. KINGMAN (sisters), Mr. S. KENT. Among others present were the Mayor and Mayoress (Ald. and Mrs. DENNIS), Mr. S. L. MATTHEWS (Sub-postmasters' Federation), Mr. R. SMITH (the Ryde Head Post-office), and Mr. J. R. DIXON. There were about 60 floral tributes. Mr. C. LANGDON was the undertaker.
