**DEATH OF MR. GALLIENNE**,- The death of Mr. G. H. GALLIENNE occurred on Friday week at the age of 54. For a long time he had been prevented from taking any active part in public life by heart trouble. For five years he had been sub-postmaster of Elmfield, and also carried on a decorating and undertaking business in that district. He was first elected to the St. Helens Council in1897, and was never defeated on subsequent occasions. Mr. GALLIENNE performed his public duties with a conscientious regard for the welfare of the ratepayers. For two years he was a member of the Board of Guardians, and during the war undertook the duties of special constable with great ability. He had served as chairman of the District Council. Widespread sympathy is felt for the widow, two daughters, and adopted son in their bereavement.

The mortal remains were laid to rest in St. John's Cemetery on Tuesday, and large numbers of people attended. The Rev. D. KLEIN officiated in the absence of the vicar. The first part of the service was held in the church. The mourners were Mrs. GALLIENNE (widow), the Misses L. and D. GALLIENNE (daughters), Mrs. REED (sister), Edward GRIST (adopted son), Mr. and Mrs. F. CLUETT, Messrs. G. and H. CLUETT (cousins), Mrs. GRIST and Mrs. KINGHAM (sisters-in-law), Mr. W. REED (nephew), and many personal friends, including Messrs. D. RAYNER, TUCKWELL, EDGINTON, and PLUMBLEY, Mr. and Mrs. Robert WHEELER, Jack ROGERS, and Messrs. PERRY and LINFORTH. The members of the District Council present were Major A. DENNIS, C.C. (chairman), Vice-Admiral E. HYDE-SMITH, C.B. (vice-chairman), and Messrs. E. HAYDEN and T. LANDER, Major G. W. CREETH, Capt. WATNEY, Capt. BARNSDALE, and Mr. W. DALLIMORE, with the clerk (Mr. C. G. VINCENT), assistant clerk (Mr. W. J. CALLAWAY), surveyor (Mr. F. J. REILLY), and several employees. Mr. F. C. PRESTON, the Ryde postmaster, and Mr. L. BRIND (deputy) represented the Post-office. Bros. b. J. JOLLIFFE (secretary East Medina Lodge of Oddfellows), P.G. BROOKS, and SNOW attended as a mark of respect to their deceased brother, who had belonged to the Oddfellows for 36 years. Mr. H. CAYME and other well-known residents were also present.
