Death of Mrs. C. A. GRACE.- The death on Monday, of Mrs. Christina Ann GRACE, widow of Mr. W. H. GRACE, occurred rather suddenly at Lhassa, John-street. With her husband, she was formerly well-known in local agricultural circles, having farmed at Fairlee, near Newport, for about 12 years and afterwards at Alverstone Farm, Whippingham, for 18 years. She came to reside in Ryde on her husband's death in 1925. Her only son, Clifford John, an R.A.F. officer, was reported missing in the last war. She is survived by her daughter, Mrs. H. WARREN, of Cardiff, and three step-daughters, of whom Mrs. D. STEWART is in Canada.

Canon MOXON officiated at the funeral service in the Parish Church on Thursday. The mourners were Mrs. H. WARREN (daughter), Mrs. H. F. A. WILLIS and Miss F. M. GRACE (step-daughters), Mr. and Mrs. H. ROEBUCK (brother-in-law and sister-in-law) Miss F. SCOTT, of Newport, Mr. Edward W. WAY (executor), Mr. and Mrs. H. M. and Mr. N. WAY, Miss MARTIN (nurse companion), and Mrs. RIDING (housekeeper). Miss E. F. HARRIS (sister) was prevented by indisposition from attending, and Mrs. S. WRIGHT, Miss C. M. HARRIS, and Mrs. F. M. NEALE (sisters) and Miss A. WRIGHT (niece) were also unable to be present. The Women Legionists were represented by Mrs. LININGTON and the Mother's Union by Mrs. DUNFORD. The floral tributes included one from the British Legion.
