DEATH OF CAPT. H. E. GRIMES.—We regret to learn that Capt. Hugh Edward GRIMES (South Lancashire Regiment, retired) passed away at Monaco from Heart Failure on Thursday week. For over 50 years he had resided at Quarrthorpe, Binstead, and was a respected and esteemed resident. For health's sake he had resided in the South of France with his wife and daughter during the winter. He was 77 years of age and was of Scotch extraction.

Among the local societies in which he was interested were the Horticultural Society, of which he was president and a frequent exhibitor at its shows, the Conservative and Unionist Association, and the British Legion. He was formerly a member of the Royal I.W. Golf Club and used to take part in the pigeon shoots of the I.W. Gun Club at Ashey, in which ex-King Alfonso sometimes took part. He was a kindly and jovial man, who was much loved in the village. Sincere sympathy is felt with the family.

The funeral took place at Monaco on Saturday.
