**DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MISS HADFIELD.**—The death of this esimable lady (mentioned in our obituary last week) took place at her residence, The Cedars, Queen's-road, on Thursday of last week. Miss HADFIELD has for many years personally conducted a bible class for young women in the Town Hall on Sunday afternoons, and in this and other ways has endeared herself to a large number of young women in the town, who held her in the highest esteem. For some five or six months however, Miss HADFIELD has been in very delicate health, and her work has been carried on for her by others. She gradually sank until she died, as stated above, on thursday week. That she will be missed is quite certain, and the large number who attended at the funeral on Wednesday, showed the love which was felt for her.

The funeral took place at the cemetery, the Rev. W. SAUNDERS reading the service in an impressive manner. Some four or five hundred persons attended at the cemetery, and many of those present carried bouquets of lovely flowers and laid upon the coffin at the conclusion, the grave was almost completely covered with these floral tributes of affection. The coffin was of polished oak, with bright brass fittings, and was conveyed to the cemetery in a hearse followed by three mourning coaches containing the mourners.
