DEATH OF MR. C. M. HAIR

Mr. Charles Mitchell HAIR, of 1 Cambridge-villas, Swanmore-road, passed away on Saturday. Deceased, who was 72, was a native of the town, and spent most of his life here. He was very well known, not only in Ryde, but in different parts of the Island, and much respected by all who were acquainted with him. As a boy he served his apprenticeship with Messrs. W. and J. WOODS, as a Whitesmith, and afterwards followed that trade, but had lived in retirement for two or three years. He was at one time a Volunteer, and served as a drummer. He was also an old member of the A.O.F.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, a service being held at St Michael's Church. The Rev. W.F.J.HANBURY officiated. The mourners were Messrs. C. B., and D. HAIR (sons), Hugh and Harry HAIR (brothers), and A.ATTRILL. The wreaths included one from the choir boys of St. Michael's Church.
