DEATH OF MRS. HATHWAY.- The funeral of Mrs. Henrietta Elizabeth HATHWAY, of Quarrhurst, Binstead, took place at Ryde Cemetery yesterday (Friday). The deceased died on Monday after having been confined to bed for a fortnight. The choral service took place at All Saints' Church. The Rev. Hugh LE FLEMING (vicar) officiated, assisted by the Rev. H. M. LEATHLEY (Rector of Binstead). The graveside was lined with evergreens and flowers. The outer coffin was of wax polished English oak with raised lid, on the top of which was a large brass-mounted oak Latin cross with a brass plate engraved "Henrietta Elizabeth HATHWAY, died 17th Sept., 1923."
