**DEATH OF MR. ROBERT HEWARD.-** It is with sincere regret that we have to chronicle the death of Mr. Robert HEWARD, of 139 High Street, who passed away on Monday at the ripe age of 87. The deceased had been ailing for some time but in the end his death came somewhat unexpectedly. A native of Ryde, he was well known and was very highly respected. For many years he was a fisherman as was his father before him, and carried on the business of a fishmonger. Though never serving as a sailor he was a true son of the sea, and had on several occasions been the means of saving the lives of people in danger of drowning..

The funeral took place yesterday (Friday) afternoon, the first part of the service being held at St. James Church, the Rev. G. C. RUBIE officiating. The principal mourners were Mr. George HEWARD (son), Mrs. HETHERINGTON, Mrs. GREENSLADE, and Mrs. SALTER, the Misses Mary, Kate and Eliza HEWARD (daughters), and Mrs. William HEWARD (daughter-in-law). There were several most beautiful floral tributes. Much sympathy is felt and has been expressed with the family in their bereavement.
