FUNERAL OF LIEUT.COL. P.G. HEWETT.

The interment of the late Lieut.Col. **P.G. HEWETT**, which took place on Tuesday morning, was made the occasion of displaying the very marked respect and esteem in which he was held. The coffin (which was of polished oak, with panelled sides, raised lid, and brass fittings) was first taken to the Parish Church of All Saints. It was met at the north door by the Rev. Canon PHILLIPS (rector of Binstead), and the Rev. W.R.C. HAMILTON (curate of All Saints).

The mourners were Commander Paul HEWETT, R.N., (son), the Misses HEWETT (daughters), Major and Mrs BARRY and the Misses BARRY, Dr PRESTON, Mr and Mrs A.D. BARRY, and servants of the St. Ann's House. The Royal I.W County Hospital was represented in the church and at the grave by the Rev W.H.E. WELBY (chairman), Mr G. SHEDDEN, J.P., Mr M.W. HUNTER, J.P., Commander Douglas FORSYTH, R.N., Major E.C. MURRAY, Mr W.H. RIDDETT, J.P., Lieut. Gartside TIPPING, R.N., Mr J.N. HATHAWAY (members of committee), Mr Alfred WOODWARD (Hon. Consulting Surgeon); Messrs. Evelyn RICH, T.A. BUCK, J.D.DAVIES and F.J. WADHAM (Hon. Medical Officers), Mr William G. DAISH, (Hon. Dental Surgeon), Rev R. NUTT (chaplain) and the Nurses. The Royal Yacht Club (of which Col. HEWETT had been a member since 1885) was represented by Mr WINDELER (secretary), Mr W.R. RATCLIFFE, Mr E.R.RATCLIFFE, Gen. NOWELL, Lieut.-Col. J.M. ENGLAND, Capt R.C. DAUBUZ, J.P., Col F.D. WALTERS, Mr W.H. WALFORD, Mr G.P. QUAYLE, Capt GREEN, Mr A.H. TATTNALL.

There were also present the Rev W.M. CAMERON (vicar of Holy Trinity), Capt W.F. MARRIOTT, Ald GROVES, J.P. Messrs Tenison SMITH, H. DURRANT, W.E. WRIGHT, J.B. PURNELL, H. LONG, JAMES (Binstead), etc. The Rev. A.R. WISEMAN read the lesson in the church, and after the first part of the service the procession started for the Cemetery. The hearse was followed by fourteen carriages, amongst those who sent carriages being Lady COCHRANE, Mr and Mrs HUNTER, Lieut. Gartside TIPPING, Dr DAVIES, Mrs TATTNALL, Dr BUCK, Dr RICH, Dr WADHAM, Major LOWTHER CROFTON, Commander FORSYTH. At the Cemetery the final ceremony was performed by the Rev. Canon PHILIPS. The inscription on the coffin was-
