EX-COASTGUARD OFFICER'S DEATH

The death occurred at the Bellevue Nursing Home, Ryde, on Tuesday, of Mr. **Arthur William HOGG**, of Elma Cottage, at the age of 82. Although born at Southampton, he had spent most of his life in the Island. He joined the Navy in 1886, and served until 1894. From then onwards he was employed in the Coastguards at practically all of the Island stations, except for seven years spent in Scotland. During the 1914-18 war he was in charge of the Firth of Forth station. When he retired in 1919 he held the rank of first-class warrant officer and station officer.

Mr. HOGG was a member of the Binstead Parish Council for a number of years, a Freemason, and a member of the naval branch of the Oddfellows. He is survived by his widow, three sons, and two daughters.

The funeral took place yesterday, a service being held in Binstead Church.
