Death of Mr. Richard HOLT.--- We regret to record the death of Mr. Richard HOLT, a well-known and respected resident, which took place on Friday last. Mr. HOLT was for 40 years engineer at the works of the I.W. Railway at St. John's-road. He was a native of Lancashire and came to Ryde in 1867, soon after the construction of the railway from St. John's-road to Shanklin, which was afterwards extended to Ventnor.

The funeral took place at St. John's Cemetery on Monday. The first part of the service was conducted at Holy Trinity Church by the Vicar (the Rev. J. E. EDDIS) and the committal sentences were pronounced by the Rev. C. E. HUGHES.

The mourners were Messrs. D. W. HOLT, R. HOLT, and F. B. HOLT (sons), Mrs. SUTHERS (daughter), Mr. and Mrs. ATTRILL (daughter and son-in-law), Mr. E. SWEETMAN, and Mr. W. STAINER. Among those also attending were the employes at the St. John's-road Railway-works, which were closed on the occasion.
