MRS. C. HOPGOOD

With the passing on Wednesday of Mrs. Clara HOPGOOD, at the Victoria Nursing Home, Ryde, at the age of 81, the town has lost a resident who for many years was a prominent social worker.

The widow of Mr William HOPGOOD, a former town Councillor, and Borough Auditor, she was the oldest member of the Holy Trinity Mother's Union, and of the Ryde and District Liberal Association. For a number of years she had belonged to the County Hospital Working Party, and was a valued helper at the Dr. Barnardo Bazaars, and for the Missions to Seamen. Mrs. HOPGOOD was a native of Ryde, and lived for most of her married life in Player Street. Her death is a loss to the town, and she is mourned by a wide circle of friends.

The funeral took place on Saturday, at Holy Trinity Church. In the absence of the Vicar, (the Rev. L. N. ST. ALPHONSE), the services were conducted by the Rev. E. J. FORSE, at the church and the cemetery. A large number of friends attended at the church. The chief mourners were Mr. and Mrs. Mendl HOPGOOD, (son and daughter-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. C. LIFE (son-in-law and daughter), Kenneth and Jack LIFE (grandsons), Mr. E. COOK (brother), Miss. A. COOK and Miss. M. COOK (sisters), Mr. C. KING (nephew), Mr. and Mrs. E. KING (nephew and niece), and representing the Liberal Association, Mrs. W. R. TAYLOR, and Mrs. HENRY. There were many friends, representing the Mother's Union, present, and also Mr. and Mrs. P. J. JENKINS, of Newport, (friends).
