## **DEATH OF LADY HORNBY**

Much sympathy is felt for Admiral Sir Windham HORNBY, K.C.B. (who for over a year has resided in Ryde), on the loss of his wife, Lady HORNBY, who died on Saturday last, at their residence, Southlands.

The funeral took place on Wednesday afternoon, and the great number of beautiful wreaths that covered the coffin, testified to the esteem in which the deceased lady was held. The coffin was of pannelled and polished oak, with heavy brass mountings. It was conveyed to the Cemetery in an open hearse, and followed by six mourning carriages and pairs.
