OBITUARY
MRS. A. E. HOWARD-BROOKE

We regret to announce the death of Mrs. **Alice Eliza HOWARD-BROOKE**, widow of Colonel R. E. F. HOWARD-BROOKE, which occurred at her residence, "The Lawn," Spencer Road, on Wednesday last. Mrs. HOWARD-BROOKE was a loyal and generous supporter of All Saints' Church, the Royal I.W. County Hospital, and all charities, and was exceedingly well-known in the town. She was the daughter of the late Mr. Samuel RIDLEY, of the Castle, St. Helen's, who was for very many years Master of the I.W. Foxhounds. Father and daughter used often to ride to hounds together.

The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon, the first part of the service being held at All Saints' Church, the Rev. W. N. MARTIN (vicar) officiating. The service was fully choral, the hymns being "Jesus lives" and "Peace, perfect peace." Psalm 90 was pronounced, and the lesson was taken from St. Paul's Epistle to the Corinthians, ch. 15, vr. 20.
