DEATH OF MRS. MARK HUNTER. – Another highly esteemed resident has been lost to the district by the death of Mrs. Elizabeth Hannah HUNTER, the octogenarian widow of Mr. Mark William HUNTER, J.P., which occurred somewhat unexpectedly at her residence, Pellhurst, Pell-lane, on Tuesday, after an illness of only a week's duration. During recent years the deceased lady had suffered from

lameness, following an accidental fall, which had prevented her from participating, as was her wont for many years, in social and welfare work.

The youngest daughter of the late Capt. Sir Robert OLIVER and Lady OLIVER, who resided at Millfield, Queen's-road, Mrs. HUNTER was the last survivor of her family. In her early days she took a great interest in and taught at the Swanmore Sunday-school, and was afterwards a constant worshipper at the Parish Church. Prominent among the many useful works which she undertook in the parish was that connected with the almshouses in Newport-street, the inmates of which considerably benefited by her active sympathy and help over a long period.

Mrs. Mark HUNTER's brother, the late Rev. Robert OLIVER, will be remembered at the first Vicar of WHITWELL, a living which he held for about 40 years. Mrs. HUNTER also lent valuable aid in that parish, where she was well-known and highly respected.

The late Mr. Mark HUNTER was a barrister and a Justice of the Peace for the borough. For some years he was vice-chairman of the County Hospital, and predeceased his wife by 26 years. Mr. and Mrs. HUNTER took up their residence of Pellhurst in 1875.

The funeral took place yesterday (Friday) afternoon, the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church.
