FUNERAL OF MR. MARK W. HUNTER. J.P., Of RYDE We regret to record the death of Mr. Mark W. HUNTER, J.P., which took place at his residence on Monday at the age of 65. Deceased, who was a barrister-at-law, but did not practise, was one of the senior justices of the borough. He was most charitably disposed and took a great interest in such benificient institutions as the I.W. Infirmary. the Ryde Relief Society, and for very many years was honorary treasurer of the local branch of the S.P.G. He was also a warm supporter of all the organisations in connection with All Saints' Church.

The funeral took place at the Ryde Cemetery yesterday afternoon. The first part of the service was held at All Saints' Church and was chorally rendered. The Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. J. SHEARME) officiated assisted by the Rev. W.H.E. WELBY, the other clergy present being the Revs, S.H. WOODIN and C.L. BLAKE. The body, which was enclosed in a polished oak coffin, was wheeled on a bier. On the top were two lovely floral crosses.
