**The Late Mrs. E. HUNT.** The funeral took place at St. James's Church on Tuesday of Mrs. **Edith HUNT**, of Camelia, York Avenue, who died the previous Thursday, aged 75. Mrs. HUNT was the widow of Mr. J.H. HUNT, who died in March 1952. He was well-known locally as a member of the Hampshire Football Association and secretary of the East Cowes Vice Football Club for 26 years. Mrs. HUNT had patiently borne for 25 years of suffering.

The Vicar (the Rev. E.F. KING) conducted the service and the hymns "Abide with me" and "O God our Help" and the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm were sung. The family mourners were Mr. and Mrs. O.R. WITHERS (son-in-law and daughter), Mr. Archie BLACKLOCK and Mr. and Mrs. G. BLACKLOCK (brothers and sister-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. T. SHARP and Mrs. A. FRAMPTON (brother-in-law and sisters), Messrs. D. BLACKLOCK and R. CHEVERTON (nephews), Miss M. FRAMPTON (niece), and Messrs. W. HUNT and J. and M. CUNNINGHAM. Messrs. J. and Arthur BLACKLOCK were unable to be present owing to illness. Floral tributes included wreaths from the Conservative Club; C. and A. Sports and Social Club. Interment took place at Asheys Cemetery in her husband's grave.
