DEATH OF A NONOGENARIAN

One of Ryde's oldest inhabitants, Mrs Eliza JACKSON, passed away at No. 3, Player Street on Saturday last. Deceased was very well known in Ryde, and had resided here for over 50 years. She was the widow of the late Mr Thomas John JACKSON, late of London and Ryde, and was in her 92nd year.

The funeral took place on Wednesday. Prior to the interment a service was held at the Holy Trinity Church, the officiating clergy being the Rev. J. E. EDDIS and Rev. N. STUBBS. The coffin was of polished elm with brass fittings, and bore the following inscription on a brass plate: "Eliza JACKSON, aged 91," The mourners were: Mr Harry JACKSON (son), Mr William UNWIN (grandson), Sergeant UNWIN (Royal Medical Corps), Mr Thomas JACKSON (H.M.S. Vernon), Mr William JACKSON, and Master Reginald JACKSON (grandsons), Master Fred UNWIN (great grandson).

A number of beautiful floral tributes were received from the following: from William (grandson); from A. W. PAGE (adopted son); from Harry, Ada and the children; "from her three sorrowing daughters- Nellie, Poppy and Edie"; from Sergeant F.
