THE LATE MR. T. H. SCOTT-JACKSON

The funeral took place on Monday of Mr. **T. H. SCOTT-JACKSON**, who died last week at the residence of his daughter, 18 High-street, Sandown. The late Mr. JACKSON was nearly all his life employed on Ryde pier, for many years as a driver of the old electric trams, until its acquisition by the Southern Railway, for which he was a driver of the present petrol car, and retired about seven years ago. He was a sidesman at Holy Trinity Church for nearly 40 years, was a trustee of the Holy Trinity Club, Star-street, and until his illness hon. Treasurer of the Holy Trinity Slate Club.

The remains of Mr. JACKSON were taken into Holy Trinity Church on Sunday evening after evensong and were received by the Vicar (the Rev. L.N. St. ALPHONSE), who conducted a short service. The Vicar officiated at the burial service on Monday, assisted by the Rev. D. WILLIAMS (vicar of Lake). of which church the deceased had lately been a sidesman. Mr. A. P. JAMES presided

at the organ and the hymns "Rock of ages" and "Through the night of doubt and sorrow" were sung. The interment, which was conducted by the Re4v. D. WILLIAMS, took place at Ryde Cemetery, where his wife, who predeceased him five years ago, was buried.

The mourners were Messrs. T.H.S., W.J.S., P.G.S., R.F.S., A.F.S., A.F.S., E.W.S., and A.E.S. JACKSON (sons), Mrs. G. GUY, and Mrs. W.G. TILL, and Mr. F. DUNFORD (sons-in-law), Mrs. T.H.S. and Mrs. A.F.S. JACKSON (daughters-in-law), Mr. T.H. JACKSON, Junior (grandson), Mr. F. UNWIN (nephew), and Mrs. COLLINS (niece).

Others present included Mr. H.E. MILLICHAP (stationmaster at Ryde), representing Mr. A.E. BELL (assistant divisional superintendent, Southern Railway), Mr. AYLWARD, Mr. J. NORRIS, and Mr. SAVILLE of the old Pier Company, Mr. C. HARRISON, Mr. and Mrs. T. SNUDDEN, Mr. A.J. GALE, Mr. C. LANGDON, and Mr. STEWARD (Trinity Slate Club). The beautiful floral tributes included those from the staff of Ryde stations, Trinity Slate Club, Trinity Club, and the Church Council of the Parish Church, Lake.

Mr. F. PERKIS carried out the funeral arrangements.

NB: We note that the above newspaper interpreted the surname as SCOTT-JACKSON, whereas the name Scott was actually a middle name, and one that was given to most of the male members of the family and their subsequent descendants.
