**MR. H. C. JAMES**

On Friday morning, 24th April, at his residence in Ashey-road the death was announced of Henry Charles JAMES, aged 74. "Harry" as he was known to everyone interested in Ryde Sport, was employed until 2 years ago as groundsman and trainer at Partland's ground. For over 50 years his sole interest was the progress of the football and cricket teams and upkeep of the ground.

Although unable, owing to his rheumatism, to attend matches recently he always wished to hear an account of the match. So keen was he, that just before his death he enquired who had won the Ryde football team's mid-week match.

He also had many photos of various successful Ryde teams he had trained before the war.

He is mourned by one son and six daughters, his wife having predeceased him.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church, conducted by the Rev. A. C. DURHAM (Vicar of St. Michael's). The chief mourners were Mr. G. W. JAMES (son), Mrs. GUY, Mrs. RAYNER, Mrs. THORNTON (daughters), Mrs. PALMER (sister), Messrs. R. GUY, F. RAYNER, G. and D. JAMES (grandsons), Mr. D. PALMER (brother-in-law), Mr. Jack JAMES (half brother), Mrs. FRAMPTON (niece). The Misses Florence and Rhoda JAMES (daughters) were unable to attend.

Among those present at the church were Mr. R. THEARLE, Mrs. A. JAMES, and the Misses JAMES, Messrs. H. G. JOLLIFFE (vice-president), W. S. RUSSELL, T.C. (chairman), L. J. WAIT and D.
