Death of Mr. M. JAMES- The death took place rather suddenly on Monday at the County Hospital of Mr. Maurice JAMES, of 71 Swanmore-road. HEWITT, Mrs. VINE, and Mr. F. C. W. WATTS. Mr. A. Carey HOOD (organist) played voluntaries and deceased's favourite hymns, "Rock of Ages" and "Forever with the Lord" were sung. Mr. LLOYD said the deceased was a man of prayer to a very unusual degree. The Bible was his constant companion. He was one of the oldest members of that church. Some beautiful flowers were received.
