OBITUARY MR. G. JANAWAY

The town of Ryde in general, and the parish of Holy Trinity in particular mourn the loss of Mr. George JANAWAY, of 48 Weeks Road, who passed away on Thursday last at the age of 69.

Mr. JANAWAY was a native of Ryde, and was for many years headmaster of Trinity Church School, retiring in 1928. All his life he had been closely associated with the church, and served nearly 50 years in various capacities. He had been People's Warden for five years and had served many years as superintendent of the Sunday School. He took a prominent part in Church activities and was Scout master of the Parish troop, and until recently secretary of the North-East Wight Division of the Boy Scouts Association. He was closely connected with the County Hospital Contributory Scheme, officiating as secretary for the south-east division.

His mother died in 1933, and a brother and sister passed away in 1934. Since then his sister, Miss Alice JANAWAY had looked after him, and she is left to mourn his loss. His life was devoted to others and his death will for long be deeply felt.

The funeral took place at Holy Trinity Church on Tuesday, when there was a large representative attendance. The coffin was met at the gate by the vicar, the Rev. L. N. ST. ALPHONSE, M.A., the porch being lined by the choir. Preceded by the Cross bearer and candle bearers the coffin was then borne to the steps of the chancel.

The service was fully choral. The 90th Psalm was chanted, and the hymns sung were "Jesus lives, no longer now," "How bright these glorious spirits shine," and "The saints of God." As the coffin was borne from the Church the Nunc Dimittis was chanted.
