The Late Mr. D. J. JONES.- The funeral took place on Monday of Mr. David J. JONES, of Portland House, Melville-street, who died on Thursday week, at the age of 79. A native of South Wales he spent 46 years in Dublin as a military merchant tailor and was one of the contractors for the Vice-Regal Lodge. Later he came to Ryde and for a time was in business at 112 High-street, retiring some nine years ago. During his residence in the town he was actively associated with the work of the Congregational Church of which he was an honorary life deacon. His wife died a few years ago.

The service in the Congregational Church was conducted by the Rev. E. H. LEWIS, and Miss Gwyneth JONES, who was at the organ, accompanied the singing of "Abide with me" and "Now the labourer's task is o'er." In an address Mr. LEWIS paid a fitting tribute to deceased's devoted services to Congregationalism and to the George-street Church. The mourners were Lady Patricia ACKLAND (daughter), Mr. and Mrs. R. L. JONES (son and daughter-in-law), Cadet Sir Norman ACKLAND (grandson, representing his sister Miss Hazel ACKLAND), Mr. W. H. LEWIS (brother-in-law), Mr. W. and Miss Dolly CAWSE, Mrs. A. HAPGOOD and Mrs. BRIGHT. Others present were Messrs. A. J. SAUNDERS and G. BEERE (deacons), W. R. PINCHARD (church treasurer), W. J. TAYLOR (secretary) HOSKING, and W. P. FROUD, Mrs. E. W POLLARD, Miss HENRY, Mrs. HILLS, Miss FILSELL, the Misses JONES, Mrs. APPLETON, Mrs. W. J. TAYLOR, Mrs. BEERE, and Mrs. TOOGOOD. Mr. H. G. JOLLIFFE (church elder) was unable to be present.

The interment was in the Cemetery and the flowers included a wreath from the officers and members of the Congregational Church.
