DIED FROM INFLUENZA THREE ILL IN HOUSE

Mr. Martin Hugh JONES, of Mountfield, High Park, Ryde, was found dead in bed on Friday morning. Mr. JONES, who was 52, had been suffering together with his wife and daughter in the same house from influenza.

The funeral took place at the Elmfield Congregational Church on Monday. The rev. E. H. LEWIS conducted the service, Miss LEAL, the organist, accompanying the singing of "Abide With Me." Interment followed at the Westridge Cemetery.
