## MR. H. F. C. LANDER

The funeral took place on Monday at Southampton Crematorium, following his death the previous Thursday, of Mr. **Henry Cornelius Field LANDER**, aged 71, of Woodham Lodge, West Hill- Road, Ryde.

A highly respected tradesman, Mr. LANDER conducted a grocery business in Park-Road for many years but retired two years ago on health grounds. His son, Mr. Hugh LANDER, succeeded him.
