

THE LATE MR. E. H. LININGTON

The funeral took place on Friday of Mr. Edgar Henry LININGTON, aged 63, of Shanva, 48 Nelson Street, who died at the Royal I.W. County Hospital on Tuesday week. Born in the town, he was a member of one of the oldest families in the district. For more than 40 years he worked at Bembridge, being successively employed by Messrs. A. R. WATSON and Messrs. WEAVER Brothers, and for many years he also took an active interest in the family's pleasure and fishing boats business on the Esplanade. Two years ago ill-health caused his retirement. His kindly nature won him many friends. He leaves a widow, one son and three daughters.
