DEATH OF MR. L. S. LONG

We regret to announce the death of Mr. **Leslie Selbourne LONG**, of 8 Partlands Avenue which occurred in a London hospital on Sunday after two months serious illness. Mr. LONG, who was 52, was the son of the late Mr. George LONG, for many years an esteemed figure in the business life of the Island and the secretary of the I.W. County Press Newspaper, Printing, and Publishing Company. He was educated at Portsmouth Grammar School and afterwards assisted his father in his many business associations. About 25 years ago, he was appointed secretary of Messrs. W.J. RUGG and Co., Ltd., tobacconists, of Newport, where he remained until his health failed at the end of last year. A devoted churchman, he worshipped for many years at St. Michael's, Swanmore, where he served on the church council and was auditor. Of late years he had attended Holy Trinity Church and had been vicar's warden since 1947. He was a member of the Portsmouth Diocesan Conference and the Rural-decanal Conference. He was a popular member of the Conservative and Town Clubs. He married in 1929 Miss Joan DEWDNEY, daughter of Mr. W. DEWDNEY, by whom he is survived, with a son and daughter.

The coffin was taken to Holy Trinity Church on Wednesday evening and Vespers of the Dead was recited. On Thursday the Vicar (the Rev, D. FORD) was the celebrant at the requiem Mass. The funeral took place in the afternoon, the Vicar officiating, Mr. J.W. MILLGATE (organist) accompanied the hymn "Let Saints on earth." The mourners were Mrs. L. LONG (widow), Miss C. LONG (daughter), Mrs. and Mrs. W. DEWDNEY (father-in-law and Mother-in-law), and Capt. and Mrs. F. CRAWFORD and Mr. Reginald WEEKS (cousins). Representatives of Messrs. W.J. RUGG and Company present were Messrs. J.C. MILLGATE (chairman), W.G. BARTLETT (managing director), F.W.H. COOL and W.H. SINCOCK and Miss C.N. RUGG (directors). Messrs. A.G. BUCKLER (sales manager), W.E. PEACH, A.J. BUTTERY, and D.A. BUCKLER, Mrs. J.G. MACKENZIE (also representing Miss J. CHAMPION) , and the Misses D. DRAYTON, M. DORE, and J. ROWE (staff), Messrs. F.W. SIBLEY and F.W. SALTER (mainland managers), and Mr. J.A. MORGAN representing the auditors (Messrs. W.C. BLACK and Co.), and Holy Trinity Church representatives were Mr. J.H. RUSSELL (people's warden), Mr. E.S. SHEPPARD (secretary church council), Mrs. A.R. ROWLAND (Sunday School), and Mrs. A. SQUIBB (Mother's Union).
