**FUNERAL OF CORPORATION EMPLOYEE.**- The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Thursday 15th, of the late Mr Harry MAKER, of Camden Cottage, Nelson-street, and a much respected employee of the Corporation in the Eastern Gardens who died at the County Hospital aged 45. He served during the war as Gunner R.F.A. in India and Mons and was a member of the British Legion, the latter being represented by the Rev. N. H. STUBBS of Holy Trinity (who conducted the service at the hospital and the graveside, Mr E. R. SAUNDERS (secretary), Capt. W. S. RUSSELL, and Messrs. P. PARKER, and G. MUMFORD. There were also present the Borough Surveyor (Mr. B. HOLNESS), Mr A. WHEELER (Town Foreman), and Messrs. Albert and Dan REEVES. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack, his late fellow workers acting as bearers, namely Messrs. H. LEAK, F. SCOVELL, W. WRIGHT, and G. WOLFE. The mourners comprised Mr B. RICHARDS (stepson), Messrs. C. and F. MAKER (brothers), and Mr W KELLY (uncle).
