INQUEST ON POLICEMEN ADJOURNED

An inquest was opened and adjourned until May 1st at Luton on Wednesday on two policemen who were killed on the M1 at Aspley Guise, Beds, early on Sunday morning.

The dead men were **P.C. Roger MATTOCKS**, 21, of Great Preston Road, Ryde, and P.C. George Leslie HICKS, 20, of 162 Goldsworth Road, Walton-on-Thames.

- P.C. Peter DURSTON, of 264 Station Road, Addlestone, Surrey, said that both men were members of the Surrey force. He said that he was driving a car south on the M1 from the Newport Pagnell service area and towing another car in which HICKS and MATTOCKS were travelling. He felt a flow which caused his car to go into the ditch. "When I got out of the car I saw the other car lying on its roof on the south-bound carriageway in flames. I tried unsuccessfully to get them out," he said.
- P.C. James CAMPBELL of Little Garth, Baker Street, Weybridge, Surrey, who is also a member of the Surrey Constabulary, said that he was travelling in the back seat of the car driven by DURSTON and after the accident he and DURSTON tried unsuccessfully to get the men out of the other car.
- P.C. Brian WALLIS, of the Bedfordshire and Luton Police, said that the fire brigade were called, put the fire out and turned the car over.
- P.C. MATTOCKS was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. R. MATTOCKS, of 87 Great Preston Road, Ryde, and a former head boy of Bishop Lovett School.

After attending Bishop Lovett School, Mr. MATTOCKS worked for over three years as a clerk at Messrs. FARDELL, of Ryde, and then joined the police force in Surrey as a cadet. He had almost completed his two-year probationary period and was stationed at the Weybridge and Walton-on-Thames area.

He was well-known in Ryde, and had been a member of the 2nd Ryde Sea Scout Group, the Young Vectis Players, and Ryde Carnival Association, of which he was a former secretary. He was an active member of St. John's Church, Ryde, where he was formerly in the choir. He attended the church on Sunday week when he visited his home on leave.

A service will be held at St. John's Church on Monday at 2.30 p.m., and cremation will follow at Whippingham.
