FUNERAL OF MISS G. E. R. McLEOD

The greatest sympathy is felt with Mrs. McLEOD, of Victoria-terrace on the death of her only daughter, and many were the tokens of respect shown at the funeral, which took place on Monday. The first part of the service was held at Holy Trinity Church, the Vicar (the Rev. J. E. EDDIS) officiating both there and at the Cemetery. DRAKE, Mrs. RANDALL, and the Misses BEVIS, LANGDON, CHIVERTON, and DE LAUNAY. The coffin was of unpolished oak, with plated ring handles, and breast-plate to match on ebony mount. The engraved inscription was " Gertrude Ethel Rutherford McLeod, born 1st July, 1883, died 11th August 1910."
