FATAL SEIZURE

A gentleman who was until recently a well-known resident of Ryde, Mr **Robert Tamplin MILLER**, who resided for some years at Dover House B., the Strand, met with a painfully sudden death last week at Dover. he was hurrying from a Channel steamer to catch the boat express when he had a heart attack and collapsed. He received attention from Sir George BLAIKER who was in the train. At the inquest death was attributed to heart disease and a verdict of "Natural Causes" was returned. The deceased gentleman was a retired tea planter, 58 years of age, and left Ryde in October last for the South of France. During the war he served as a special constable being engaged principally on the Pier and rendered good service.
