**Death of an Afghanistan War Veteran :** The death occurred at Westfield Cottage, Buckingham-road, on Sunday, of Mr. Walter MOORE, who took part in the Afghan War, and was with the late Lord ROBERTS during the famous march to Kandahar. Mr. MOORE helped fire the salute of 101 guns when Queen Victoria was proclaimed Empress of India. Deceased, who was a native of Cowes, retired from the Royal Garrison Artillery in 1899 with the rank of sergeant, and became the licensee of the Fountain Inn, Sandown. Four years later he came to live at Ryde and passed away at the age of 74. he leaves a widow, two sons, and two daughters.

The funeral took place on Wednesday.
