NONAGENARIAN'S DEATH.- The death took place at his home, 11 Well-street, on Friday week, of Mr. George MORRIS, who had attained the great age of 92. The death of his wife in March, which broke up a happy marriage partnership of 72 years, was a great blow to him. On the celebration of their 70th year of married life Mr. and Mrs. MORRIS received a letter of congratulations from the King. Mrs. MORRIS was 92 at her death. Mr. MORRIS, who was born at Cridmore, began work on a farm at the age of 8 and continued working until he was 80, after having

been in the employ of the late Mr. Henry JACOBS, coal merchant of Union-street, for 40 years. He was a fine figure of a man and retained his faculties to the last.

The funeral was at the Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. S. A. MARSH (Holy Trinity) officiating. The chief mourners were Miss MORRIS, Mrs. WATSON, of Petersfield, and Miss Eva MORRIS, of Windsor (daughters), Mr. F. CLEMENTS, of Cowes (son-in-law), and Mr. A. T. HODGES.
