### **MR. C.V. MOSES**

The death occurred suddenly on Thursday of Mr. **Charles Victor MOSES**, of 9 Swanmore-Road, at the age of 73 years. He was a native of Ryde, being born in the same house in which he died.

Mr. MOSES joined the Royal Navy as a boy, and served in the Boer and 1914-18 wars, and was in the China Seas at the time of the Boxer riotings. Among the many ships on which he served was H.M.S." Mars" one of the last sail and steam ships in the navy. He retired in 1918 at the end of the war. Although he was due for a pension earlier. He was a Chief Petty Officer at the time of his retirement. Mr. MOSES was popular in the town, and will be remembered for his thrilling yarns of the sea. He was a bachelor and leaves a sister with whom he used to live.

The funeral service which was conducted by the Rev. P.L. VAUGHAN, took place on Saturday, followed by interment at Ryde Cemetery. Mourners were Miss A. MOSES (sister), Mr. and Mrs. R.
