The Late Mrs. E. MUNDAY.- The death occurred on Sunday at 28 Monkton Street, the home of her daughter (Mrs. H. S. CASTLE), of Mrs. Elizabeth MUNDAY, aged 89, widow of Mr. S. D. MUNDAY, a former proprietor of the "Isle of Wight Times." She came here from Portsmouth 65 years ago, and with her sister, the late Miss L. B. UNDERHILL, carried on a millinery and drapery business in Cross Street.

She was a devoted member of the Baptist Church, where the funeral service took place on Wednesday. The Rev. E. J. WILLIS officiated. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. R. MUNDAY (son and daughter-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. H. S. CASTLE (son-in-law and daughter), Mr. and Mrs. H. D. CASTLE and Messrs. P. J. and R. H. CASTLE (grandchildren), Mr. W.
